Jesus values...

Fellowshipping

Scripture often commands us to love each other, encourage each other, care for each other. We accomplish these imperatives by getting to know and love each other through fellowship.

John 13: 34; 1 Thessalonians 5:11, 1 Corinthians 12:25, 1 John 1: 3.

Benefits: Love, Caring, Encouraging, Affirming, Relationship with Jesus

Following/ Mentoring

Jesus called each of us into a discipleship relationship with Him. He desires to live in relationship with us. He wants to be our friend. He also wants us to invite others to follow Him too.

Matthew 4:9, Luke 6:40, Matthew 28:18-20.

Benefits: Discipleship, Small Group Bible Study and Fellowship, Relationship with Jesus

Giving

Disciples are to emulate Jesus. He gave Himself to save us eternally on the cross. We must also give of our time, talents, and treasure. We give in appreciation for all Jesus has done for us.

John 3:16, Matthew 25:40, Colossians 3:23-24.

Benefits: Stewardship, Spiritual Gifts, Relationship with Jesus

Loving

God is love. He created each one of us because He loves us. He desires an ongoing daily relationship with us because He loves us deeply. We, in turn, reveal our faithfulness to Jesus by our love for all others. Disciples imitate Jesus.

1 John 4:8, John 13:35.

Benefits: Spirituality, Maturity, Relationship with Jesus



Praying

Every relationship is dependent on communication. Friends and family talk together as often as possible. In most cases daily. People in love talk together. This is how we deepen relationships. Scripture often highlights this vital value.

Mathew 6:7, Philippians 4:6, 1 Thessalonians 5:17, 2 Chronicles 7:14.

Benefits: Spirituality, Relationship with Jesus

Serving

Faithful disciples follow Jesus' example. Jesus, the Sovereign Creator God of the universe, came as a humble servant. We reveal our love to Jesus and others by serving them. Serving is on the opposite side of the selfishness spectrum. This is a core kingdom value of King Jesus.

Benefits: Spiritual Gifts, Roles, Relationship with Jesus

Studying/Teaching

Jesus was the greatest teacher ever. Disciples study God's Word daily. They are words of truth and life. Disciples desire to become like Jesus. Disciples share the truth about Jesus and His Word with whoever will listen. We intentionally mentor others.

Benefits: Bible, Small Groups, Discipleship, Relationship with Jesus

Worshipping

When we experience God and His grace, we must respond by worshiping Him. Worship is a natural response because we were originally created by God with the capacity of worship. It is in our DNA. Our lives will never be fulfilled until we worship our Creator/ Redeemer.
